Domestic Abuse services for Perpetrators

New services aimed at breaking the cycle of domestic abuse are now available. They will help people to reflect on their behaviour and the damage this can cause and what they can do to change.

These include:

• A single point of access, a dedicated resource to respond to enquiries and signpost people needing help with their behaviour onto the appropriate intervention. Delivered by the Change Project.

• A mentoring programme to work with young men aged 13-18 who are at risk currently using abusive behaviours within an abusive relationship. Delivered by Essex Youth Service. • An **outreach service**, to focus on engaging with people who are using abusive behaviours in their relationship, within the community. Delivered by the Change Project.

• A **prison intervention programme:** an educational behaviour change programme to challenge and underpin the attitudes of abusive behaviours for people who are in custody. Delivered by Essex Community Rehabilitation Company.

• The **bystander intervention**: an educational programme for the prevention of sexual coercion and domestic abuse in university settings.

J9 Update

This national initiative aims to provide safe and secure opportunities for people to disclose domestic abuse and access a full support system. Staff at each J9 contact point are trained to signpost, advise and spot the signs of domestic abuse. Each venue has a safe place where people can access information and use a phone to call for further help. Look out for the pink J9 heart.


